
# NEWS FEATURE: THE HISTORY OF HURRICANE NAMES

Hurricane Ida hit Louisiana on August 26, 2021. While public focus was probably on the victims of the hurricane, and rightly so, few know why the hurricane was called Ida. Or, for that matter, how hurricanes are named in the first place.

The term "hurricane" is used for storms that develop off the coasts of the U.S. and South America, while the terms "typhoon" and "cyclone" describe storms in the east Asian coast and the Indian Ocean and Australia, respectively. Technically, a tropical storm is named when it has sustained winds of 39 mph, but

it doesn't become a hurricane until its winds reach 74 mph, so a named tropical storm doesn't necessarily develop into a full-fledged hurricane.

The purpose of naming hurricanes is straightforward: to distinguish the storms. It also minimizes confusion for ships. "In the past," states an article from the National Hurricane Center, "confusion...[has] arisen when storm advisories...were mistaken for warnings concerning an entirely different storm located hundreds of miles away." Before the naming system, which is relatively new, hurricanes were referred to as their latitude and longitude coordinates, which was confusing to the public.

The World Meteorological Organization (WMO) is an agency r under the United Nations that monitors the "state and [behavior] of the Earth's atmosphere" internationally. The WMO established a universal method for naming hurricanes in the early 1950s. The Switzerland-based group created alphabetized lists of 21 names, one for each letter of the alphabet (excluding Q, U, X, Y, and Z). These names were exclusively female, which points to the history of sexism that is integrated even in weather.

The feminization of hurricanes stemmed from the meteorologists' argument that the public would not take male-named hurricanes as seriously and therefore not act as fast to prepare. However, their "concern" for public safety hardly masked their sexism that was so integrated in society. "Some male meteorologists," Galindo states in an article for Action News 5, even "used sexist clichés to describe the behavior of a storm." The image of "female fury," as mentioned by the Washington Post, was said to evoke feelings of fear and a stronger desire to evacuate. Additionally, as written by Women's Media Center, "Weathermen were said to have chosen the names of their [exes] to conjure...rage." This portrayal of females as bringers of destruction infuriated feminists across the nation, including Floridan Roxcy Bolton. Bolton was tired of the association of women with disaster and, beginning in the early 1970s, advocated for the abolition of exclusively female-named hurricanes.

Eventually, names of all genders were integrated into the 1978 and 1979 hurricane seasons. One set of six lists is for the Atlantic Ocean, and the other set is for storms in the Eastern Pacific Ocean. Hurricane season is relatively the same for both regions, occurring from mid-May to late November. Starting with "A" names, hurricanes are then given the following name on that season's list. If there are more than 21 hurricanes in a season, there are backup lists used to name additional storms (WTVM). The lists of names are cycled every six years, meaning this year's names, assuming none are retired, will appear again in 2027.

Hurricane names are retired if their impact is so devastating that using the name again would be insensitive. Examples of retired hurricane names include Katrina, Sandy, and Michael. Retired names are then replaced with other names approved by the WMO.

Climate experts agree that the frequency of hurricanes will increase as climate change worsens, so the system of naming hurricanes is prone to to include more names in the future. This year's Atlantic hurricane season is well underway, and at time of this writing, there is only one remaining name – in the Atlantic list: Victor.
